Our Next Concert Sunday, January 21, 2024 Drew Nugent & the Midnight Society

Community Arts Center, Wallingford, PA



Drew Nugent is a jazz musician hailing from the city of Philadelphia, and bandleader of the ensemble "Drew Nugent & the Midnight Society." Nugent and his ensemble specialize in traditional or "Hot" Jazz of the 1900s to the 1940s, with the main area of focus being the Jazz Age - the Roaring 20s. Nugent's instruments of choice are the cornet and piano, plus vocals. He is also known for playing an odd contraption called the "Hot Tea-Kettle," or the "Teapot Trumpet" as some fans have named it. Drew made his debut in 2005 at age 19 on the classic NPR radio show *A Prairie Home Companion*, where he placed 3rd in the "Talent from 12-20 Contest." The Midnight Society's TSJS debut was in April 2010, and they last returned for an outdoor concert in 2021. They perform the "good ol' tunes," and have earned a reputation as one of the best bands in the "trad" style.

Jazz quartet Blue Skies recaptures the infectious rhythm and tight improvisational spirit of that music in the familiar tunes of the Great American Songbook, standard jazz, and revival Dixieland. Formed in 1994 as a smaller ensemble of the traditional-jazz, six-piece band, Jerry Rife's Rhythm Kings, the Blue Skies Jazz Quartet specializes in swing music of the early jazz, pre-WW II period. We share several traits with the traditional Dixieland jazz bands of this period including an abiding commitment to ensemble jazz. Collective improvisation is the trademark of our music especially in the musical heads and extended out choruses. Each member of the band improvises solos, but under the solos you will hear background riffs and spur-or-the- moment counter melodies crafted to compliment the soloist. This integrated, dense style characterizes much early jazz especially jazz from New Orleans and Chicago.

Danny Tobias is one of the hottest and most sought after trumpet players in the region. He has worked extensively with the Tony DeNicolo Bond, Jerry Rife's Rhythm Kings, the Midiri Brothers, and has played with Kenny Davern, Warren and Allen Vache, Harry Allen, Howard Alden and John Bunch. He is often heard with the top swing and hot jazz bands in New York City.

Jerry Rife is extremely active in the jazz scene in the Midwest and East coast and is a member of the John

Johnson Trio, The Dixie Devils, and the Blawenburg Dixieland Jazz Band. He led the Great Lakes Rhythm Kings in Wisconsin and Michigan in the 1970s before moving to New Jersey in 1984. Born in Kansas, he learned to play jazz at an early age. His high school Dixieland jazz band, The Mason Dixies, performed on live nation-wide television on Ted Mack's Amateur Hour in 1965.

Pat Mercuri is the leader of Pat Mercuri's Dixie Jazz Band and plays regularly with the Midiri Brothers. The son of the legendary guitarist, Lou Mercuri, Pat is the first-call performer on guitar, banjo, and mandolin with the Philadelphia orchestra and has played show, jazz and classical music professionally in Philadelphia and New York. He has played on Broadway (Ragtime...) and with The New York Philharmonic, and has toured Europe with classical musical groups.

Bassist **Peter Reichlin** is an extremely versatile trombonist who is comfortable playing classical and all types of jazz music. He has toured with the Metropolitan Opera and with the Jimmy Dorsey Band and is currently principal trombonist with the Capital Philharmonic in Trenton. He is featured on tuba and electric bass as well as trombone with Blue Skies and has played with the Independence Hall Jazz Band and the Jazz Lobsters big band. Pete is a respected recording engineer and piano technician as well.

Sunday, November 12, 2023 Mark Shane - Pianist Provides Musical Time Travel Review by Robert J. Robbins



The most recent concert of the Tri-State Jazz Society featured stride and swing pianist Mark Shane, whose presentation took the shape of musical time travel, beginning in 1916 with a stride version of Raymond Hubbell's "Poor Butterfly," (inspired by Puccini's opera Madama Butterfly) and continuing through the late Thirties, when the program wound up with "Don't Be That Way," the classic by Chick Webb's reed man Edgar Sampson which Benny Goodman chose to open his iconic 1938 Carnegie Hall jazz concert (Shane, who has performed at TSJS with clarinetist Dan Levinson, participated in the fortieth anniversary of Goodman's groundbreaking event).

Throughout the entire two-and-a-half hour concert, Shane applied his crystalline yet swinging piano technique to a broad panoply of inter-war song classics, featuring the music of Thomas "Fats" Waller ("Ain't Misbehavin") and a little-known song from the Twenties entitled "Wait and See," which presented Shane's lone vocal), James P. Johnson, Earl "Fatha" Hines ("Rosetta"), Eubie Blake ("Memories of You"), George and Ira Gershwin ("The Man I Love"), Vincent Youmans ("More Than You Know"), Harry Barris (pianist for Paul Whiteman's Rhythm Boys, whose lead singer and drummer was Bing Crosby, who introduced the songs "Wrap Your Troubles In Dreams" and "I Surrender, Dear"), Dorothy Fields and Jimmy McHugh ("On the Sunny Side of the Street"), Burton Lane ("Everything I Have Is Yours"), Richard Rodgers and Lorenz Hart ("You Took Advantage of Me"), Harold Arlen ("Between the Devil and the Deep Blue Sea"), Johnny Burke and Jimmy Van Heusen, and Sammy Cahn and Saul Chaplin (Please Be Kind").

Shane demonstrated a combination of a powerful left hand (a stride prerequisite), superb dynamics, and a solid classical foundation. He was very well-received and is a prime candidate for a return to the Tri-State.
