PHILADELPHIA – Cornetist Danny Tobias, a [Tri-State Jazz Society](http://www.tristatejazz.org) veteran who led the Society's Annual Jam Session nearly five years ago, brings his signature lyrical phrasing and fat, relaxed tone to Community Arts Center, 414 Plush Mill Road, Wallingford, PA, on Sunday, March 20, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. Tobias has worked with such jazz luminaries as Kenny Davern, Warren and Allan Vache, Harry Allen, Howard Alden, John Bunch, Marty Napoleon, Greg Cohen and Derek Smith. Locally, he has worked the Midiri Brothers Band, Jerry Rife's Rhythm Kings and Ed Wise's New Orleans Jazz Band. Danny frequently performs with other leading traditional jazz and swing groups.

Half-price admission of \$10, payable at the door, is available for first-time attendees and members; general admission is \$20; full-time students with IDs and children are free. There are no advance sales or reservations. The Arts Center is less than a mile from the Media-Swarthmore exit of I-476 (the "Blue Route") and has free parking.
