Her musical accomplishments include eight albums, one DVD, a "New Talent Prize 2011" by the Hot Club of France for her "Live" CD, a prestigious Kobe-Breda Jazz Friendship Award, and performances with celebrated musicians such as Dick Hyman, Phil Flanigan, Rossano Sportiello, Louis Mazetier, Carl Sonny Leyland, and Danny Coots. Stephanie and husband, Paolo Alderighi, have also

recently played a benefit concert organized by retired Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor.

Half-price admission of \$10, payable at the door, is available for first-time attendees and members; general admission is \$20; full-time students with IDs and children are free.
