PHILADELPHIA – [Jon Weber](#) makes his Tri-State Jazz Society debut with a solo piano performance, sampling from 100 years of evolving jazz piano styles, at Community Arts Center, 414 Plush Mill Road, Wallingford, PA, on Sunday, September 9th, at 2:00 p.m. Jon hosts NPR's *Piano Jazz with Jon Weber*, (successor to the highly-regarded *Piano Jazz* hosted by Marian McPartland), continuing the program's four-decade run. Jon has recorded and toured worldwide, winning numerous honors for performance and composition. Largely self-taught, Weber has perfect pitch and remarkable melodic recall. He has performed and recorded with a broad range of international musicians, won a Bistro Award for his cabaret show *Another Hundred People*, in which he presented the music and lyrics of Stephen Sondheim along with Broadway performers KT Sullivan and Jeff Harnar and produces and performs a popular concert series entitled *From Joplin to Jarrett: 100 Years of Piano Jazz*.

Half-price admission of \$10, payable at the door, is available for first-time attendees and members; general admission is \$20; full-time students with IDs and children are free. There are no advance sales or reservations. The Arts Center is less than a mile from the Media-Swarthmore exit of I-476 (the "Blue Route") and has free parking.
