PHILADELPHIA – [Paris Washboard](#), a French jazz group devoted to the revival of traditional jazz, will perform a rich and still enlarging repertoire from the 1920s and 1930s, inspired by giants such as James P. Johnson, Fats Waller, Duke Ellington, and even original compositions at Tri-State Jazz Society's concert at Haddonfield United Methodist Church, 29 Warwick Road, Haddonfield, NJ on Sunday, February 23rd at 2:00 p.m.

Due to their originality and unique sound that emanates from just four instruments: clarinet, trombone, piano, and washboard, Paris Washboard brings something new to a jazz style that originated in the earliest years of the genre.

Peerless in the trad jazz world, Paris Washboard's worldwide success since 1988 is a testament to the quartet's conviviality, youthful enthusiasm, and exceptional musical individualities.
